Walter French Junior High was opened for seventh, eighth, and ninth graders in the fall of 1925. The first principal was J.W. Slaughter, who served for 19 years. He was succeeded by Hyrtl Freeman, who held the post for 21 years. Frank Throop took over in 1965 and remained until Shirli Vioni came in 1973.

The west wing was added in November of 1975. It contained seven classrooms, special education rooms, two art rooms, and music rooms for band and choir.

At present, Walter French has 1050 students, consisting of sixth, seventh, eighth, and ninth graders. Construction on a new gym was started in February of 1976.






Walter French's A team finished the year without winning a game. They were plagued throughout with injuries and problems. Coach Shinsky felt the team worked hard, however.

The J.V. team finished with a 6-3 record. Mr. Ramsey, the coach, said that this was the finest team he has ever had the pleasure of coaching.




