SHALL a solid south rule? is the question to be decided this fall, and the voters of the north are not likely to lose sight of it.

Every day that goes by increases Garfield's chances of election. Thinking democrats all over the north are coming to the conclusion that rebel success by the ballot will be as dangerous to our country in 1880, as the rebel success by the ballot would have been in 1860.

Of the four doubtful states, New York, Connecticut, New Jersey and Indiana, three gave republican plums in 1878, although all gave democratic majorities in 1876.

In 1876, with substantially no greenback vote cast, the democratic majority in New York was 32,742; in New Jersey, 12,443; in Connecticut, 2,000. But with the heavy greenback vote of 1878, these states gave the following republican plums: New York, 35,601; New Jersey, 10,750; and Connecticut, 2,482.

In Indiana the democratic majority of 5,515 in 1876 was increased by the enlarged greenback vote of 1878, to 14,113.

Of course there was a large falling off in the vote of 1878, but enough remained away from the polls proportionately, the greenbackers would seem to have helped the republicans in New York, Connecticut and New Jersey, and to have hurt them in Indiana. This being so, a reasonably close vote in Indiana, if the state should go democratic, which no intelligent republican would presume a republican victory in the other doubtful states, and that would certainly elect Garfield.

An Interesting Letter on the Political Situation by D. B. Harrington.
