



Out of the thirty-five tiny tots who started kindergarten in 1934, Agnes Ellsworth, Helen Johnson, Harold Darbor, Eugene Duling, Jack Furney, Bruce Hancock, James Moores, Robert Parisian, Russell Spalding, and Donald Cone are the surviving members in 1947.

Those who arrived to strengthen our class during the first through the sixth grades were Kenneth Allen who came in the second grade, Norma Halava, Don Lott, Stanley Patton who joined us in the third grade, Janet Fillingham, Robert Traill, Laurie Wilson in the fourth grade, and Raymond Brown in the sixth grade.

During our Junior High School years of seventh and eighth grades, Rosemarie DeChelbor joined us as we entered into this part of high school with new ideas and new ideals to learn.

At last came the most trying and tempting year of all, the Freshman. Four members of our present Senior Class joined us during that year to help carry the load of jests and remarks from underclassmen. They were Marjorie Johnson, Freda Johnstone, Laura Mazurek, and Glenn Tropf.

The name of Freshies was soon forgotten and we assumed the name of Sophomores. Our enrollment was increased by six members destined to leave us before graduation.

When school began the following fall, we assumed the more honorable name and place as Juniors. This year, Lillian Davison, Reva Horaney, Wilma Ireland, Joyce Quick and Robert Fansler joined us to help out on a successful Junior play and reception.

The next year we occupied the most important and dignified position of all, Seniors. This year was the happiest and best of all our high school years. Hilda Straub joined us this year along with Robert Smyth and Wallace Beck who returned from the armed forces, and Mr. Myron E. Smith, our class advisor. We were saddened to learn that at the end of the semester when roll was taken, Iris Sanford and Shirley Martin were no longer with us, which leaves a total of thirty-one members in the class.

The names of three other people are linked among our memories. Edward Kaiser and Julius Pekrul who left to join the navy, and George Phelps whom we lost in a fatal accident during our Sophomore year.

Many friends have joined and left us during these twelve happy years but this constitutes those who have stayed and helped complete our school days book of memories with us.

As weeks and days roll by, the dawn of class day and commencement appears on the horizon. The evening is fast approaching when we will receive our diplomas which will take us from Holt High School prepared in a sense, to begin life's work, the task of which rests on each individual. We will not have the mutual friendship of each other as in our school days to help us over the stony way, but we will never forget the impresions which these friendships have planted deep in our hearts.
